

### LEADS - LEADERSHIP, EDUCATION, AND DEVELOPMENT SEMINAR

**Do you want to learn more about leadership?** All De Anza District club members are eligible to apply and the deadline to apply with your local club is fast approaching!

### Act Now!

The LEADS program is designed to identify and develop future Federation leaders, for the Club, District, State, and GFWC National level. Each Club is encouraged to send a LEADS candidate to District for the selection process. One candidate each year will be chosen to represent the District at the CFWC State Convention. At CFWC LEADS, one District Representative will be selected to go to GFWC LEADS to be a LEADS graduate. If your club candidate is not selected at District this year, they may try again. The selected District Representative will be expected to come back to District and lead a District seminar to share their knowledge with the other candidates.

The representative chosen by District to go to CFWC, may not apply for LEADS a second time, even if they are not chosen to represent the State at GFWC. However, most of the LEADS training comes at the State level. The Representatives learn about Federation, protocol, public speaking, club finance requirements, club ethics, and conflict resolution. Most representatives come back from LEADS training enthused and committed to moving up in Leadership. Many representatives find that LEADS is their most meaningful experience in Federation.

To apply for LEADS, candidates should submit the following items to De Anza District Leadership Chair Jan Emde at cfmd8@verizon.net by January 1, 2025. Late submissions will not be accepted.

- 1. CFWC LEADS application (also on the De Anza District website)
- 2. 5x7 photo of the candidate
- 3. Candidate's one-page resume

If selected, the representative will be required to attend the CFWC LEADS program. If the District LEADS representative is selected at CFWC to represent the state, the representative will be required to attend GFWC's LEADS program, as follows:

- CFWC LEADS, CFWC Winter Board Meeting, February 6-8th, 2025 at Glendale, CA
- GFWC LEADS, GFWC Convention, June 4-June 9, 2025, Atlanta, GA

The financial commitments required, such as travel, lodging and food, is costly. The De Anza District will provide our LEADS representative shared lodging and \$200 to assist with costs at CFWC LEADS. The representative's Club may also assist with costs. GFWC provides the state representative a stipend of \$325 and lunch during the LEADS program. Even with these contributions, there will be costs that are solely the responsibility of the representative. The participants are responsible for making their own travel and lodging arrangements.
